What a refreshing description of Evensong at St Mark's in North End (Pompey Chimes, July) and how encouraging it is to hear from a church that values

and supports traditional Evensong. One might ask why we always presume that changing the old for the new is always bet-

Here at St Mary's, Carisbrooke, we have full (sung) Evensong every Sunday, except special services of hymns, readings and prayer to reflect special occasions such as harvest. Visitors to the island are always welcome to join us, frequently coming back year after year. Our choir is 20-strong when in full flow, including about six junior choristers.

I agree with Tom Kennar when he says: "Informal worship doesn't replace more traditional services, but offers a place in which new ideas can be tried and, if found helpful, offered in other parts of the Christian life.'

As we travel through the Kairos process, we need to feel open to God in all sorts of ways, and I welcome this. But we are sometimes in danger of throwing out the baby with bathwater. I would be interested in your comments.
