

COWPLAIN: John Eames, a Tearfund

regional manager who worships at St Wilfrid's Church in Cowplain, has recently returned from Kyrgyzstan.

He led 12 volunteers and Tearfund staff members to see what the charity's money is achieving in the poorest of the former Soviet states, and met a deputy of the parliament.

"We visited five groups that are almost totally dependent on Tearfund to support the work they are doing," he said. "In this secular Muslim state, our partners are individual Christians. We visited small-scale, home-based groups teaching women and teenagers sewing and craft skills, IT and dress-making."

One of the most moving projects they visited was a refuge for ex-prisoners in the countryside. It's a halfway house that helps former inmates to find homes, get jobs and break away from addictions. Another
